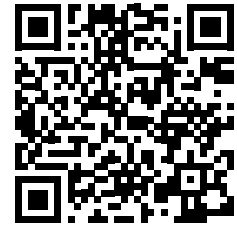
Olena Tereshchenko has worked as a journalist and as a cultural events organiser at a library. As a teacher and PR manager, she has been involved in literary projects for children and young people.

Borges) the Book of Sand – in the sense that it, like the original Book of Sand, which was bought from a stranger Scotsman for a monthly pension and a Wycliffe Bible, and like that sand, has neither beginning nor end. The number of pages in it could be infinite, as infinite as the universe that we call Science Fiction is, if not for the unpleasant obviousness: the author-compiler is fully aware that those hundred or so involved authors and a little over a thousand processed articles are a drop in the ocean of Science Fiction. Be that as it may, even in this form, this guide offers a whole set of terms and concepts from the most diverse areas of the science fiction universe, created by the imagination of the most talented science fiction writers abroad: improbable planets and strange races, amazing technologies and incredible monsters... And finally, we would like to express the hope that this book is only the first step in the “inventory” of the science fiction universe. “A Short Guide to the Universe: Planets, Races, Technologies” is the first encyclopedic publication in Ukraine dedicated to science fiction. It includes about 1,100 mini-articles-terms, covering the work of 125 science fiction authors. The selection of authors and their works is unsystematic and is based rather on the preferences of the author-compiler. The science fiction works covered are diverse in genre – here you will find both novel cycles and individual novels, as well as short stories and short stories.
