Olivier Laurence [ə'li:vɪ, eɪ] – (1907-1989), a British film and stage actor, director of the National Theatre Company (1961-73)

Ottawa ['ɒtəwə] – the capital of Canada

P

Prometheus [prə'mi:θiəs] – *Greek myth*, a Titan, who stole fire from Olympus to give to mankind and in punishment was chained to a rock, where an eagle tore at his liver until Hercules freed him

Q

Quebec [kwɪ'bɛk] – the largest Canadian province

R

Raleigh, Sir Walter ['ra:li] – (1552-1618), English navigator, colonizer, and writer, introduced tobacco and potato to Europe

Rayleigh, Lord John William Strutt ['reɪli] – (1842-1919), a British physicist, who discovered argon (1894) with Ramsay and made important contributions to the theory of sound, the theory of scattering of radiation and got the Nobel prize for physics in 1904

Rhode Island [rəʊd] – the smallest state in the US

Rockefeller Center ['rɒkə, fɛlə] – a complex of 19 commercial buildings in New York City

Rotorua [,rɒtə'ru:ə] – a city in New Zealand, at the SW end of Lake Rotorua; centre of forestry; noted for volcanic activity

S

Scafell Pike [skɑ:'fɛl] – a mountain in NW England, in Cumbria in the Lake District: the highest peak in England

Shania Twain [ʃə, naɪ.ə 'twɛɪn] – (1965) born Eileen Regina Edwards; a Canadian country pop singer-songwriter

Smithsonian Institution [smɪθ'səʊniən] – a national museum and

institution in Washington, D.C., founded in 1846 by James Smithson, primarily concerned with ethnology, zoology, and astrophysics

Solent ['səʊlənt] – a strait separating the Isle of Wight from the mainland of England

Spaniard ['spænjəd] – a native or inhabitant of Spain

T

Tasman Abel ['tæzmən'eɪbl] – (1603-1659), a Dutch navigator and explorer who was the first European to discover Tasmania and New Zealand (1642)

Taupo ['taʊpəʊ] – the largest lake of New Zealand

Texas ['tɛksəs] – the second largest state of the USA

Timor Sea ['taɪmɔ:] – an arm of the Indian Ocean between Australia and island Timor

Tombaugh Clyde William ['tɒmbəʊ] – (1906-1997), US astronomer, who discovered (1930) the planet Pluto

U

Uluru [,u:lə'ru:] – a large sandstone rock formation in the southern part of the Northern Territory, central Australia

Uther Pendragon ['u:θər pɛn'dræɡən] – a legendary king of sub-Roman Britain and the father of King Arthur

V

Vermont [vɜ:'mɒnt] – a state in the northeastern US: crossed from north to south by the Green Mountains

W

Windermere ['wɪndə, mɪə] – the largest lake in England and a popular tourist area in the Lake District

Y

Yonge Street [jʌŋ] – formerly listed in the Guinness Book of Records as the longest street in the world at 1,896 km connecting the shores of Lake Ontario in Toronto to Lake Simcoe, a gateway to the Upper Great Lakes

Yorkshire [ˈjɔ:kʃɪə] – a county in northern England

Z

Zorro [ˈzɒrəʊ] – a fictional character (which means “the Fox” in Spanish), who wears a black mask, fights with a sword and makes a sign like the letter “Z” with it in the air or even on an enemy’s shirt
